Volunteer technical assistance focuses on workforce development skills, agriculture technical training, and entrepreneurship.

The objective of the Rural Adaptation & Resilience project is to decrease the vulnerability of rural agrarian populations to the impacts of changing climate and weather patterns. Volunteer technical assistance focuses on climate-smart agriculture practices, sustainable water use, disaster planning, and institutional capacity building.
