The 2018-2023 Farmer-to-Farmer Program in Myanmar will conduct 76 volunteer assignments in the states of Shan, Kayin, Sagaing, and the Mandalay and Magwe Regions.

Tree Crops

The objective of the Farmer-to-Farmer Myanmar Tree Crops project is to accelerate growth of the country's tree crops sector with expanded production and the use of tree-based products for farm sustainability. The project will employ crosscutting approaches to build on the country's long, successful history of tree crop-centered agriculture, while also assisting in the growth of its coffee sector that has recently become internationally recognized for high-quality Robusta and Arabica varieties. Volunteer technical assistance will also focus on high-value export crops including macadamia and avocado.
